Trial date for both age groups are 16.09.2023 with a reserve date for those that cannot attend on 23.09.2023. Booking to be done through <u>https://www.trybooking.co.uk/CMQJ</u> as previous years. All selectors at trials now have to attend an athlete ID Course as requested by England Netball.

There will be a second trial for the U15s, this is for girls who have already been selected to make sure they are put in the correct squads eg: U15s or Intermediates.

Due to another sport being given the use of the Notts Boys High School court from December 2023 onwards we will be training at Bilborough College for the 23/24 season (hopefully for the foreseeable future). U13s and Intermediates form 5.30 pm to 7.30 pm and U15s from 6.30 pm to 8.30 pm.

# Safeguarding Officer/ Equality Inclusion and Diversity Officer report for NCNA clubs meeting 13<sup>th</sup> July 2023

On the 21<sup>st</sup> December, Sarah Wassell, Safeguarding and Welfare Manager from England netball circulated a questionnaire to be completed by the 16<sup>th</sup> February 2023. She has been monitoring the way in which Safeguarding concerns are raised and processed. There are challenges in how the safeguarding process is currently structured. This includes the process appearing complicated, lack of confidence in the process, concern around delegated risk, and of course time constraints. The aim is to have safeguarding processes fit for purpose and seek the views of County Safeguarding officers / Committees in the process.

Following return of the surveys, Focus Group Sessions were held and I attended one. Safeguarding processes used by similarly structured NGB's, training requirements, role specifications etc were discussed. Results and recommendations were then be forwarded to the EN Board for consideration and any changes will be communicated along with further support to ensure our sport remains a safe and enjoyable place for all.

# Umpire forums 2023-24

# **Umpires working towards IO and qualified IOs**

**All** must attend a face to face forum at John A Stephens. Dates: Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> September 7.00-8.30pm or Sunday 24th September 10.00-11.00am. Content will be: Notts League umpire protocols/procedures, codes of conduct and rules Q&A.

There will also be additional forums for IOs (dates tbc) prior to Summer League 2024.

# C award umpires

There will be no forums for C award and above this season.

However, all C award umpires will be asked **to engage in CPD** by choosing a league date between September and end December 2023 (this may be extended if necessary) when they will be observed by current approved mentors and given feedback on what went well and areas for further development. This will be preceded by a zoom session on either Saturday  $16^{th}$  September, 10.00-11.00 am or Wednesday  $20^{th}$  September, 7.00-8.00 pm to explain fully the purpose, process, criteria and will incorporate codes of conduct.

# C\* and above umpires will also not need to attend a forum this season.

CPD will be offered in 2024 (date tbc) which will be a mixture of theory and practical based on the areas for development highlighted to umpires in this season's feedback.

## Personal liability insurance for umpires

This is included in EN membership so **umpires are insured** when they officiate **ENGLAND NETBALL RECOGNISED COMPETITION / ACTIVITY.** In Notts, this includes Winter, Summer and Sunday leagues at NUSA, Two Counties leagues, BUCS fixtures and Schools' tournaments at national age groups (U19,16 and 14). In the region, this includes Senior and Junior Regional Leagues, qualifying tournaments and play-offs.

For any other netball activity which is not registered with England Netball, umpires are advised to have their own personal liability insurance in place as their insurance as England Netball members does not cover them. This includes social and commercial leagues and leagues which are not registered with England Netball. If in doubt, check with the league organisers first. Don't assume you are insured as an umpire.
